This catalog contains the Summer School course offerings for the students in Third Grade. There is a wide variety of opportunities in curricular areas such as Reading, Math, and Science. Also many enrichment opportunities are offered. Please read through the course listing carefully before making your choices.

Registration

Please indicate your choices on the registration form, found on the last page of the catalog. Select classes based on the grade your child **completed** this year. Return the registration form to your child's school office as soon as possible, as some classes have limited enrollment. Please be sure to select alternate classes where available. Students will be placed in classes with limited enrollment in the order in which their registration forms are received at school. Forms are due to your child's school office by March 10. Any additional submissions received after March 10th will be considered depending on available space.

Transportation

Transportation will be provided from Lyndon Station Elementary June 12 - June 30 and July 10 - July 28. Students will be dropped off Mauston High School prior to 8:00 am. Students will be returned to Lyndon Station following the dismissal of classes at noon and lunch. Pick up will be at 7:20 am and drop off will be at 12:45 pm at Lyndon Station Elementary School. Otherwise, transportation is the responsibility of the family. The bus to/from Lyndon Station Elementary is the only bus.

Class Location

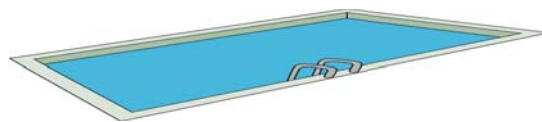
Classes will be held at Mauston High School unless otherwise noted.

Summer Breakfast and Lunch Program: June 12 - June 30 and July 10-July 28.

Free breakfast and free lunch will be offered each day of Summer School. All students age 18 and younger residing in the Mauston School District are able to get free breakfast and free lunch each day. There are no forms to fill out. According to the guidelines of the grant, students must eat their meals in the lunchroom. They **cannot** "take it to go"! Lyndon students will have the opportunity to eat lunch before the bus leaves to take them back to Lyndon Station Elementary.

Summer School Course Descriptions

SESSION 1 (June 12 - June 30)

ELEMENTARY LEVEL ENRICHMENT COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Below are the course descriptions for each of the courses being offered during the first session, listed by the subject area. New courses for this summer are designated with *NEW* by the title.

Reading Enrichment - Session 1

R03 Magic Tree House Summer Club Grades 1, 2, 3 10:00 am- 11:00 pm

Take part in wonderful, magical adventures from the Magic Tree House series. Join Jack and Annie as they solve problems, help people, and travel through time. You will learn through hands-on arts, crafts, games, writing, and other activities based on the theme of each book we study.

R05 Percy Jackson Book Club Grades 3, 4, 5 9:00 am - 10:00 am

Students will read and share excerpts from Rick Riordan's books as well as learn about mythological characters and Ancient Greece. We will prepare projects and reports based on the information learned.

Math Enrichment - Session 1

M04 Math Game Time Grades 3, 4, 5 8:00 am - 9:00 am

Math is more than just classroom work. It can be a fun, educational experience of interacting with other students while reinforcing the basic math skills through Everyday Math games, board games, card games, Internet/iPad, and outdoor activities.

M05 *NEW* The Science of Math Grades 3, 4, 5 11:00 am - 12:00 pm

In this STEM based course, we will combine life science with gathering data. We will visit to a stream to gather aquatic data (speed of water current, temperature, etc.) to explore real life math problems.

Science Enrichment - Session 1

S04 How Do Vegetables Grow? Grades 2, 3, 4 8:00 am - 9:00 am

Did you ever wonder how different vegetables grow? Some grow underground and others above ground. Some grow tall and some cover the ground on vines. We will experiment with different types of seeds and seedlings to learn how different vegetables grow in the Grayside Garden. We will also learn to identify the plants we want to grow versus the weeds. If you want to learn about vegetable plants and don't mind getting your hands in the dirt come and learn with us!

S05 Exploring The Ocean Grades 4, 5 10:00 am - 11:00 am

Through hands on activities, stories, and technology, this class will explore some of the interesting aspects of the ocean.

S06 Aquatic Wild Grades 3, 4, 5 11:00 am - 12:00 pm

We will explore how wild animals get water, why the wetlands are important to wildlife and humans, and the functions of the wetlands. We will go on a water safari, and see if we can trace the foods we eat back to an ocean, river, lake, or even a salt marsh.

S07 Recycled Inventions Grades 1, 2, 3 11:00 am - 12:00 pm

Interested in taking apart items, or making something new from something old? This is the course for you!

Fine Arts Enrichment - Session 1

A03 Ceramics - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 8:00 am - 9:00 am

In this course, students will explore the many ways to use clay. They will create a wide variety of art works.

A04 Drawing - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 10:00 am - 11:00 am

Students will explore different drawing media and subjects. They will use charcoal, colored pencils, marker, oil pastel, and pastel chalk. We will create a variety of art works including portrait and animal drawings.

A07 Musical STEM - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 8:00 am - 9:00 am

Where children get the chance to use science, technology, engineering, and math to create and play musical instruments.

A09 *New* Our Big Show! ** 2 Hour Course Grades 2, 3, 4 10:00 am - 12:00 pm**

Students will prepare an elementary level musical during the first session of summer school. Along with memorizing lines, songs, and dances; students will be making their own costumes and sets for their show. We will be performing "Go Fish!" an elementary musical by John Jacobson. Join in the aquatic fun as little Tiger Shark and his/her unique collection of friends discover how their differences make them each special.

This course will be limited to 30 students and require an additional \$10 to cover the cost of a t-shirt.

Foreign Language Enrichment - Session 1

L03 Spanish is Fun! - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 9:00 am - 10:00 am

¿Hablas español? You soon will! In this class, students will learn Spanish through games, activities, and conversation. You will learn about likes/dislikes, weather, colors, animals, and lots more!

Health Enrichment - Session 1

H03 Fitness and Fun Grades 3, 4, 5 10:00 am - 11:00 am

If you like movin' and groovin', this is the class for you. We'll be playing games and doing activities that will help you get physically fit while working on teamwork and having fun. You will also learn some healthy eating and lifestyle habits.

H04 Kids On The Move Grades 3, 4, 5 11:00 am - 12:00pm

Let's get active! learn about the importance of exercise and health. We will work within the three elements of fitness: strength, endurance, and flexibility through aerobic and anaerobic exercise, games, obstacle courses, as well as stretching activities.

Technology Enrichment - Session 1

T01 Learn Coding With Robots 01 Grades 3, 4, 5 9:00 am - 10:00 am

Robotics, video games, and online gaming sites are created through computer programming also known as coding. In this class will learn simple programming language as well as drag and drop programming. You will be using coding sites, coding programs and Spheros to practice your coding skills. If you enjoy challenge then this class is for you.

Social Studies Enrichment - Session 2 (3-5)

SS11 Wild About Wisconsin! Grades 3, 4, 5 10:00 am - 11:00 am

Did you know that Hammerin' Hank Aaron began and ended his baseball career in Milwaukee, WI? Is it true that Prairie du Chien, WI, was once known as a national Pearl Capital? Learn some interesting and unique things about our state. We will create projects to show what we are learning. From Abbotsford to Wisconsin Dells, we will have lots of fun exploring places around our great state!

SS12 Wild About Our World! Grades 3, 4, 5 11:00 am - 12:00 pm

There are so many incredible and cool things about this planet we live on. Let's discover them together! Find out about other countries' customs, animals, and plants. We will create projects to show what we are learning. We will have lots of fun exploring how other cultures are similar and different to life in the Mauston area.

Fine Arts Enrichment -Session 2

A13 Painting - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 9:00 am - 10:00 am

There are many different types of paint. The students in this course will use tempera, acrylic, and watercolor paints to explore a variety of subject matter.

A16 Basic Scrapbooking - 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 11:00 am - 12:00 pm

Do you have pictures that tell a story? Students will create a simple paper scrapbook with pictures of you, a trip, your family, or an event you want to remember. You will learn to organize, trim, and matte pictures, journal to help your pictures tell the story, and decorate your book. You will need to supply 12-20 pictures on a similar topic. You may need to supply some basic scrapbooking decorations and supplies.

A17 Voice Lessons **2 Hour Course Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 8:00 am - 10:00 am**

This is a class for beginners and advanced students. We will learn popular and choral music. Join us as we learn to sing as an individual and as a group. Develop your skills to become the next contestant on the Voice.

A18 Summer Musical ** 2 Hour Course Grades 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8 10:00 am - 12:00 pm**

A class for all musical performer wannabe's! This class will teach you how to audition, practice, and perform in a musical. You will act, sing, create the set, and perform for an audience. Everyone will have a part in the musical. This will be a fun learning experience, and we will show off our skills with a performance for family and friends at the end! This year we will be performing: **Abacadabra Aladdin!**

Health Enrichment - Session 2

H14 Kids On The Move 02 Grades 3, 4, 5 9:00 am - 10:00 am

Let's get active, learn about the importance of exercise and health, and set and reach goals! We will challenge and improve upon the three elements of fitness: strength, endurance, and flexibility through aerobic and anaerobic exercise, games, obstacle courses, as well as stretching activities.
