

## Eagle After School Program 2024-2025 Report

The Eagle After School Program is a Nita M. Lowey 21<sup>st</sup> Century Community Learning Center made possible through a grant from the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and the US Department of Education. The mission of the program is to provide a wide variety of enrichment activities to support the academic achievement of elementary students and their families who reside or attend a school within the School District of Mauston.

The EASP offers students a healthy snack, academic enrichment, opportunities for physical fitness, and social and emotional wellness on a daily basis. The EASP is open to 4K-5<sup>th</sup> grade students and operates on regularly scheduled school days from school dismissal until 5:45 pm. The program specifically recruits students in need via teacher, principal or family referrals.
