Alliant Energy Innovation Scholarship-

<u>Mensa Education Scholarship:</u> Mensa Foundation scholarships are awarded on the basis of an essay that describes the applicant's career, vocational, and/or academic goals along with information that shows how the applicant intends to achieve the stated goal. An applicant does not need to be a member of Mensa, but must be a U.S. citizen or a legal resident. Some scholarships may have specific restrictions, e.g., major or area of study. <u>Apply on-line by January 15</u> at mensafoundation.org
